

Judgment Day | Micah 1:2-7

Summary: In Micah 1:2-7, God is the sovereign and holy king of this world, who is concerned about what happens in this world, and who will punish those who commit evil in this world.

1. **God is the sovereign and holy king of this world.** (v. 2; Isaiah 6:1-7)

- God is holy refers to His character as totally good and entirely without evil.

2. **God is concerned about what happens in this world.** (v. 2; Proverbs 15:3; Jeremiah 16:17; Psalm 44:21; Psalm 37; Hebrews 4:13)

3. **God will punish those who commit evil in this world.** (v. 2-4; Revelation 6:12-17)

- Theophany: a manifestation of God
- The Bible describes these manifestations with physical and meteorological signs: earth shaking, mountains splitting, dark clouds, lightning, fire, trumpet blasts, stars falling, and other visible descriptions.

Application:

- First, the judgment of the world is tied to the judgment of Israel. (v. 5-7; Romans 3:9-23; Acts 17:31)
- Second, judgment occurs throughout history but there will be a final judgment at the end of history. (Romans 1:18-25)
- Third, who can stand in the judgment? (Revelation 6:15-7:14; Romans 5:9; Romans 8:1)
